DILSTON BYPASS SURVEY WORK TO GO AHEAD

Department of Infrastructure, Energy and Resources

Survey work for the planned Dilston bypass section of the East Tamar Highway upgrade will go ahead in late October or November.

The surveys are designed to establish accurate land acquisition areas for the road corridor following previous consultation with affected landowners and also to prepare plans for new title

boundaries.

Although some aspects of the bypass design still need to be agreed between the Launceston City Council and the Department of Infrastructure, Energy and Resources (DIER), it is important that these preliminary tasks are completed so that work on the overall

project is not unduly delayed.
