EGG ISLAND POINT RESERVE BATTLE

Egg Island Point Reserve in Hillwood is one of the few public access areas to the Tamar within 25 km of Launceston. It was a community-maintained reserve for many years until Crown Land Services has taken over management and allowed the area to be overgrown and unfriendly in terms of river access.

Whilst it is understandable that standards of river access need to be maintained, it appears that the Hillwood Community is prepared to undertake a persistent and consistent approach to CLS to ensure that this area remains a well maintained and accessible area to the public.

Local residents have appealed to MLC Ivan Dean for support in assessing the area and negotiating with CSL for a more community friendly approach to the management of the area.

After a detailed letter to CSL on the issue and a response from Manager Fiona Steel, local advocate on the issue, Lyndsay Millar reports:

"I think we have a major battle on our hands to get a common-sense management policy for Egg Is. Point.

CLS now have three policies for the area that place the environment ahead of the real risk to human lives.

The policies support:

- 1. Refusal to undertake fuel reduction burning on land they control bordering the community
- 2. allowing dead trees stand for five months after being warned that they posed a real risk to the public; only removing them after one fell across a well-used walking track and on to the beach. Lyndsay claims although they are "habitat", they are deadly.
- 3. blocking off the only access to allow launching a boat when ramp is unusable due to weather conditions, to carry out a rescue.

This access has been used for over 80yrs. without causing any problems.

The matter has not been raised previously because access has never been blocked before.

Lyndsay questions who has decided that the 'vehicle access is not an appropriate use for the beach' and challenges the statement that the boulders "do not hinder access to the shore" It is just not true he claims."

Lyndsay states that the permit from Parks to restore the beach did not include closing off vehicle access. He claims that the response from CLS does not address all questions he asked in his letter.

The Hillwood Progress Association will now apply to CLS for a permit to install two picnic tables on the Point at no cost to CLS.

Ivan Dean, Member of the Legislative Council for Windermere, in his assessment of the situation after visiting the area with concerned residents states: "Regarding the trees, not even the green trees have a strong root hold on this point and that is obvious from the die back and the root structure on the dead trees that have been pushed over. I am not sure why some agreement can't be reached in this case ... an agreement that will ensure protection of the area and as has occurred over the past many years. I am also of the view that if the area which is an attractive and accessible picnic area, is semi locked off, not managed effectively, some people are likely to vandalise the area.

Before the rock placement occurred I understand there wasn't any major damage (if any at all) to the foreshore area and or picnic open space. If I am right I don't understand why that course of action was taken. It is clear that you and I think with some other support, have kept the area accessible to the public over a long period and that is commendable because it is one of the only areas close to Launceston where the public can picnic and fish next to the river.

The undergrowth needs to be kept tidy because without some clearing, it is a fire hazard and no doubt will suffer the consequences of unlawful burning in the future and the roads in the area will not be sufficient for fire control. Hence it will be a threat to residences in the area.

I am yet to receive a response from CLS relative the concerns I have raised with them. I have requested the maps of the 'point' as we discussed and will catch up with you when I receive any information on these matters."

We await a negotiated outcome on this issue and commit to supporting it as a community to ensure it remains a well-maintained and inviting area for public access. Ed.

Work on the extension has now been completed by contractors. We have an occupancy permit and are undertaking the long and detailed task of fitting out the SHED for operations. We also await connection of 3 phase power by Hydro. The extension now includes our Hupmobile chassis and our woodworking machinery. The original building will be used for metal work and housing the accumulating tools and machinery we have for tackling many projects.

We are currently working on some outdoor tables for the Catholic Education Office in town for their professional development needs. We are designing and producing a new set of gates for the St Matthias Church and continuing our supply of early learning block sets to educational centres in Tasmania. Members are readily employed whenever they attend either to complete their own tasks using the equipment we offer the community or assisting with the projects that keep us sustainable as an organisation.

We have just received news that a submission to The Australian Men's Shed Association for equipment and lighting for the SHED extension has been successful. We look forward to installing this equipment and to further expand our offering for the men of the community.

A recent visit by the Launceston branch of the Veteran Car Club of Australia was well rewarded for them in discovering that the missing (known) 1929 Hupmobile. It was rewarding for us in acquiring much advice and personal knowledge that accumulates when men get together and share experiences. A further visit in October is planned for

Deployment to Victoria

Early on the morning of March 29, the brigade received a request from the Northern Region of the Tasmania Fire Service to provide our heavy tanker for deployment to Victoria....with a departure date set for that EVENING!!

We hastily prepared the truck for departure and our newly elected 3rd Officer Ben Jones departed that afternoon to the Spirit of Tasmania along with other appliances from Bridgewater, Prospect, and State Operations. Following this deployment we along with other brigades have been rotating crews in and out of Victoria, and as this issue of Smoke Signals goes to print, we have committed our appliance out to April 17. The TFS have put in place alternative response arrangements whilst our primary vehicle is away.

We would like to offer our sincere appreciation and gratitude to the families and employees of all the TFS personal travelling to Victoria in aid of Emergency Management Victoria, the Country Fire Authority, and the affected Victorian communities that were recently heavily affected by severe fires in the south west of that state.

By way of a brief explanation, following the aforementioned fires there were signification environmental and health concerns from fires burning in heavy peat beds in and around the township of Cobden. The Tasmania Fire Service was requested to provide assistance by way of our specialist Compressed Air Foam capability which is well suited in supressing the smoke and Carbon Monoxide emanating from these fires. CAF is also well proven in decreasing the time to extinguish such fires. Dilston Brigades request came as our appliance is CAF enabled and the brigade is well recognised in the application of this medium.

We will provide more information in the next edition of smoke signals following the appliances and crews from Victoria.

End of Permit Period

The Tasmania Fire Service has announced that the Fire Permit Period will cease at 2am on Tuesday April 10. Thankyou to all residents that asked for permits this season and for the registering of burns in general.


