

Vegie Planting Calendar for Northern Tasmania.

August Week 1: Peas, Broad Beans

4: Lettuce; Radish; Peas; Start tomato seedlings indoors .

<u>September</u> week 1:

Peas;Lettuce;Broccoli;Pepper seedlings indoors; spinach Cauliflower.;Cabbage; Broad Beans (last chance).

- 2: Carrots: Radish
- **4:** Bush Beans(will survive if no frost)

October week1:

Cabbage; Broccoli; Celery seedlings; Potatoes (buy seed potatoes now)

2: Parsley; Summer Carrots; Silver Beet; Beetroot; Spring Onions; Leeks;

Lettuce; Radish; Spinach

- **3:** Bush beans (in cloches) sweet corn seedlings (propagated indoors) Climbing beans.
- **4.** Sweet Corn (direct seeding)-sow 3 crops 2 weeks apart for continuous harvest.

Many home sellers are listing with me in the hope to secure a sale to a local buyer, or mainland interest, which is still strong.





Birds of The Tamar.....

The Fan-tailed Cuckoo is a slender cuckoo, 24cm - 28cm in length. Its mournful, descending trill often draws attention to its presence. The adult bird is easily identified by its generally dark slate-grey back and wings, becoming pale rufous below, with a boldly barred black and white under tail. Younger birds are duller and browner in colour.

The striking yellow eye ring (slightly greenish in young birds) is clearly visible from quite a distance. I usually hear these birds distinctively. Their call is a monotonous trill, rather like a low postman's whistle.

Fan-tailed Cuckoos are found throughout eastern Australia, south-western Western Australia and Tasmania. Birds in Tasmania migrate to the mainland in the non-breeding season. They are among the more commonly observed members of the cuckoo family, especially in the favoured habitat of open forests, woodlands and similarly vegetated gardens. Individuals are often seen perched on an exposed branch when calling.

The Fan-tailed Cuckoo enjoys hairy caterpillars in its diet, but will also take a variety of other insects and their larvae. Food is located from an exposed perch and is seized in flight or from the ground. The bird returns to its perch to eat the prey.

The breeding season of the Fan-tailed Cuckoo is between August and December in Tasmania. As with most other species of Australian cuckoos, it is a brood parasite; laying its eggs in the nests of other species of birds. Host species of the Fan-tailed Cuckoo include flycatchers, fairy-wrens, scrubwrens and thornbills, particularly the Brown Thornbill, Acanthiza pusilla. A single egg is laid in the nest and one of the host's eggs removed. The young cuckoo generally hatches earlier than the host's eggs (12 to 13 days) and proceeds to eject the other eggs or hatchlings . The host parents then rear the chick seemingly oblivious to the invasion.

We are progressing well with our newest juniors and also with a new senior member who is close to being operational. The brigade is committed to continuing the association with our community but at the risk of it sounding

What is a Volunteer?

A volunteer is a person who freely donates time and effort to serve in a volunteer brigade.

Most volunteers participate as operational firefighters. This involves responding to emergency incidents such as bush fires, structure fires, motor vehicle incidents, chemical spills, etc. Other volunteers participate as members who support the brigade's operational firefighters in areas like community fire safety, junior development, fundraising, communications, brigade administration and equipment maintenance.

Why be a Volunteer?

Many people who decide to become volunteers are motivated by a desire to do something for their community and help others in need. However, there are other aspects to volunteering which people also find very appealing, such as:

- · Educating people in the community about fire safety
- · Continually learning and practicing useful skills
- · Doing physical work
- · Belonging to a team
- · Forming friendships and socialising together

Who are Volunteers?

Volunteers come from all parts of the community, different backgrounds and a wide range of ages.

Men and women of every trade, profession and calling become volunteers.

Volunteers are found in isolated rural areas and in country towns; they live in the big cities, the suburbs and the five and ten acre blocks on the urban fringe. They are people just like YOU.

Volunteer Work

Working safely

Your safety is the most important thing to us. Safety is everyone's responsibility and there are times that we face risky situations in our fire fighting responsibilities.

The TFS has established safety systems, excellent personal protective equipment and nationally accredited training programs designed to ensure its members work safely together. Our volunteers are expected to behave safely by being safety conscious and following safe work practices.

Being part of the team

When you join a brigade you become part of a large team of volunteers who have an important job to do for their community. To do this job properly and safely its very important that everyone does their bit to try and get along with each other. The TFS has some basic values you will be required to follow to help ensure there is a positive environment in the brigade for all our members.

Providing services

If you are successful in becoming a volunteer you may be required to help in providing the types of services listed below, depending on your role and the type of brigade you have joined.

- Responding to bush and grass fires
- Responding to structural fires
- · Responding to road accidents and hazardous materials incidents
- Attending to alarm calls
- Conducting fire hazard reduction (controlled burn-offs)
- Providing fire safety advice and programs to the local community
- Supporting local community events such as school fairs and shows

How often these types of services are performed will vary depending on the brigade and its location.
